# 2014 Chicago Area Political and Social Behavior (CAB) Workshop

The eighth annual Chicago Area Political and Social Behavior Workshop (CAB) will be held on Friday, May 9, 2014, at Northwestern University. The goal of these yearly workshops is to bring together Chicago-area social scientists who share an interest in political and social behavior.

- The format is as follows:
  - o There will be four paper presentations, with discussion following each presentation.
  - o A moderator (for each paper) will keep time and pose a few questions; however, there is no formal discussant, thus the discussion will largely come from the audience.
  - Each presenter will have 30 minutes to present, followed by approximately 30 minutes of discussion (1 hour total).
  - o Additionally, we will have a novel 45 minutes session: a methodological discussion about the use of hypothetical scenarios in behavior research.
  - o The preliminary schedule appears below.
- Papers will be posted at least one week in advance on the workshop website.
- A light breakfast, lunch, snacks, and a dinner will be provided. (*Dinner is only for those who participate in at least part of the conference*.) Part of the purpose of the meeting is to provide scholars from different schools with an opportunity to interact and exchange ideas in an informal setting.
- Each graduate student will be matched with a faculty member from a different university who shares his/her interests. Time will be provided for these pairs to interact (e.g., during break times and lunch).

## Directions to Workshop Location

- The workshop will take place at the Norris University Center, Northwestern University, Room 202 ("The Northwestern Room"), 1999 Campus Drive, Evanston, IL, 60208.
- Driving: Take Sheridan Road into Evanston from the north or south. Enter Northwestern at Campus Drive on the southeast end of campus, Entrance A, just off of Sheridan. The entrance is next to Evanston's south beach, and is marked with signs for Northwestern University, the Block Museum, and Northwestern's Boat House. Note there is non-trivial construction you will encounter but you will get through it. If vou want more details about it, see:

### Directions to Dinner

- A light breakfast, lunch, snacks, and dinner will be provided. The dinner will take place at Mt. Everest Restaurant, 630 Church Street, Evanston, IL; Tel: (847) 491-1069. See www.mteverestrestaurant.com.
  - O If you are walking (which takes under 10 minutes): From the Norris Center, walk west until you hit Sheridan Road. Then walk south on Sheridan Road for two blocks, then continue south on Chicago Avenue for two more blocks until you reach the intersection of Chicago and Church Street. Turn right on Church Street and you will see the restaurant located at 630 Church Street.
  - o If you are driving (which should take just 2 or 3 minutes): Drive south on Chicago Avenue (Sheridan Road runs into Chicago Avenue at the southern tip of the campus) until you reach the intersection of Chicago and Davis Street. Turn right on Davis Street, then take your first right turn onto Orrington Avenue. Take your first right turn onto Church Street. You will see the restaurant located at 630 Church Street. Metered parking is available in the area around the restaurant or you can partk in the Church Street Self-Parking garage (525 Church Street).
